PT. Yokogawa Indonesia and Directorate of Water Supply Development of Ministry of Public Work and Housing have signed a Partnership to Improve Competency in Water Treatment Plant Automation System

PT. Yokogawa Indonesia has signed an agreement with Directorate of Water Supply Development of Ministry of Public Work and Housing on February 6, 2015. It aims to develop a customized set of programs on process control and measurement to enhance the competency level of all Directorate Water Supply Development officers nation-wide. Endorsed by the Director of Water Supply Department, Ir Mochammad Natsir, MSc and the President Director of PT Yokogawa Indonesia, Mr. Naoki Nakamura, at the Ministry of Public Works and Housing in Jakarta Selatan, the agreement identifies the essential collaboration to achieve the milestone set by the Indonesian government of delivering 100% safe water access by year 2019.

Incorporating the Yokogawa automation system into the first fully automated water treatment plant in Bali Indonesia, the Petanu water treatment plant has processed and provided up to 300 liters of clean water per second to some parts of 3 districts in Bali Province; Badung, Gianyar and Denpasar. Further expanding its operations in Bali, the new Penet water treatment plant situated near the Tanah beach is currently under construction and will be commissioning soon; in year 2015.

Yokogawa delivered FAST/TOOLS SCADA software package, STARDOM™ network-based control system, analyzers, and a variety of field instruments to these water treatment plants and incorporated collaboratively with the expertise of the local Indonesian plant builder.
